

Overview of waste bins

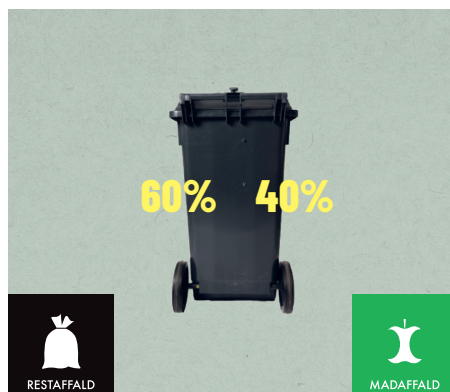
Bin 1

Residual waste – in sealed bags

- Soot and ash
- Cat litter
- Disposable nappies
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Gift wrapping paper and ribbon
- Pizza boxes



NOTE! Waste must be in sealed bags before going in the container.



Food waste – in food waste bags

- Meat, chicken, fish, rice and pasta
- Fruit and vegetables, bread and cakes
- Fat and sauce
- Coffee grounds, coffee filters, tea leaves and tea filters
- Kitchen roll from use in the kitchen
- Flower bouquets



NOTE! Food waste must be in the green waste bags before going in the container.

Bin 2

Plastic/food and drink cartons – emptied and scraped clean

- Food and beverage cartons
- Plastic bottles and canisters
- Shopping and freezer bags and plastic film
- Plastic food trays
- Bubble wrap



Paper and cardboard – clean and dry

- Corrugated board and cardboard
- Torn cardboard boxes – the size of magazines
- Advertising, printed paper and envelopes
- Newspapers, weekly/local newspapers
- Paper



Bin 3

Metal – emptied and scraped clean

- Aluminium and foil trays + metal from tealight candles
- Beer and soft drinks cans without a deposit
- Aluminium food cans
- Metal screw caps



Glass – emptied and scraped clean

- Wine, spirits or other bottles
- Household glass and other glass packaging
- Shards of the glass types mentioned
- Drinking glasses



Box for hazardous waste

Hazardous waste and small electronics (max. 4 kg)

- Batteries (must be in a sealed bag)
- Small electronics such as cables, telephones, etc.
- Spray cans



- Light bulbs
- Paint, varnish and glue
- Oil, petrol and oil filters
- Insect and plant poison
- Fertiliser
- Chemicals (acetone + turpentine) – preferably in original packaging
